

Sterling Lake Loop Project Summary

- Approximately 25 feet of trail was raised with stepping stones and stairs to provide dry passage through a drainage area below the road
 - 13 stepping stones set
 - 4 stairs installed
 - 1 drainage structure (water bar) installed
- Over 252 hours logged on work site
 - >74 hours of work preformed by volunteers
 - Repeat volunteers contributed half of the total hours



Warbler Trail Project Summary

The treadway was elevated by covering exposed tree roots with natural locally-sourced surfacing material to create a more uniform and better draining surface.





Project Accomplishments:

Surfaced 300 feet of trail with approximately 540 cubic feet of mineral soil.

Over 36 crew hours, over 10 volunteer hours.
